

General Action Lab info and guidelines (ver 0.02)

The Oversight Committee (OC) is in charge of the lab and is responsible for the quality of the research conducted therein. Sometimes this means that they have to make big decisions.

New Researchers in the lab:

If you are hoping to run an experiment in the Action lab, you will first need to present your research proposal/plan at the Attention and Action meeting, which is held on Friday afternoons at 3:30. This will give the members of the OC a chance to assess the quality and feasibility of the proposal and to determine if it can be done in the lab.

All new researchers will need to 'align' themselves with one of the members of the OC. This is meant to ensure that the OC does what it is tasked with doing: overseeing the research conducted in the lab.

You will need to obtain ethics for your experiment *prior* to beginning your experiment.

BioSemi

If you are hoping to use the BioSemi, you will first need to go through a series of training sessions with Shahd Al-Janabi (EEG System Custodian) to make sure that you know how to use it and how to take care of it.

TMS

If you are hoping to use TMS, you will first need to go through extensive training with Paul Sowman.

Optotrak

If you are hoping to use the Optotrak system, you will need to train with either Matthew Finkbeiner or Jason Friedman.
